#### **ADMONITION OF ST. FRANCIS**

#### 19. On the humble servant of God <sup>1</sup>

Blessed (is) the servant, who does not consider himself better, when he is magnified and exalted by men, as when for example he is considered to be vile, simple, and despised, because as much as a man is before God, that much he is and nothing more. Woe to that religious, who has been placed on high by others and does not wish to descend by means of his own will. And "blessed (is) that servant" (Mt 24:46), who is placed on high not by means of his own will and desires always to be beneath the feet of others.

Chapter One, Article 3 of The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

The present rule, succeeding Memoriale Propositi (1221) and the rules by the Supreme approved **Pontiffs** Nicholas IV and Leo XIII, adapts the Secular Franciscan Order to the needs and expectations of the Holy Church in the conditions of changing Its times. interpretation belongs to the Holy See and its application will be made by the General Constitutions and particular statutes.

Article 25 of the Rule states, in part, "Local fraternities should contribute toward the expenses of the higher fraternity councils." Those who were closest to Helene may not be at this point yet, and still mourn over their loss; to them I send my embrace and comfort, and invite all our members to do so.

To all those in our fraternity, and for those who have gone before us, we offer a prayer of hope and thanks, as we keep in our hearts one of St. Francis's last prayers, a blessing he left his brothers:
