Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

In Munificentissimus Deus, Pope Pius XII proclaimed on November 1, 1950 that "we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that Immaculate the Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, completed having the course of her



earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."⁵ The document notes that the assumption - also called the "dormition," which means "falling asleep" - of Mary had been believed by Christians since the early centuries of the faith and on down through the It explains the Assumption as centuries. something of a counterpart to the Immaculate Conception, which had been established as dogma in 1854, as both events show the unique situation of Mary as the mother of God: "She, by entirely unique privilege, completely overcame sin by her Immaculate Conception, and as a result she was not subject to the law of remaining in the corruption of the grave, and she did not have to wait until the end of time for the redemption of her body."

The Feast of the Assumption is celebrated on August 15; it is a holy day of obligation unless it falls on a Saturday or Monday. A feast celebrating Mary in August is very ancient, going back

to Byzantine times. In many countries the Assumption is also a public holiday. ⁶
