

The Information Corner

Dec 2 – Memorial of Blessed Maria Angela Astorch

Maria Angela Astorch was born in Barcelona on Sep 1, 1592. In 1603, she entered the Capuchin Poor Clare monastery begun by Angela Serafina Prat. Because of



her young age she waited five years as an aspirant before beginning the novitiate on Sep 7, 1608.

As novice master, she went to Zaragoza on May 9, 1614, to found a new monastery there. In 1624, she was vicar and three years later, abbess. On June 2, 1645, she went with four other sisters to found a new monastery at Murcia, under the title "The Exaltation of the Blessed Sacrament." The new monastery suffered frequent floods, especially in 1651 and Maria Angela remained abbess until 1661. She spent her spare time studying the sacred texts and the great Church writers, she came to a profound understanding of the Breviary, the schedule of prayers and hymns recited each day. Maria Angela Astorch died in 1665 at the age of 75. She was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II on May 23, 1982.⁴

Fortitude is the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations and to overcome obstacles in the moral life. The virtue of fortitude enables one to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions. It disposes one even to renounce and sacrifice his life in defense of a just cause. "The Lord is my strength and my song." "In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." (CCC 1808)



Our Father Francis was careful to point out the balance between cultivating fortitude in order to overcome evil while also remembering that our strength comes from the Lord and not from ourselves. In his Admonitions, St. Francis taught: "Even if

you performed wonders such as driving out demons, all these things would be an obstacle to you and none of them would belong to you nor could you glory in any of these things. But in this we can glory: in our infirmities and in bearing daily the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."



May the Lord cultivate the virtue of fortitude in our sister Susan, who is making profession this month, as well as our brothers and

sister who are advancing to candidacy. We thank Him for the blessing that they are to all of us, as they strengthen our fraternity in our walk together towards the Lord in the footsteps of Francis and Clare.
