

May 17th – Feastday of Saint Paschal Baylon.⁴



Born on the Feast of Pentacost on May 24, 1540, in Spain of poor and pious parents, he was christened Pascua in honor of that Feast. Between the ages of seven and 24 he worked as a shepherd and began a life of mortification. He was

able to pray on the job and was especially attentive to the church bell, which rang at the Elevation during Mass.

In 1564, Paschal joined the Friars Minor and gave himself wholeheartedly to a life of penance. Though urged to study for the priesthood, he chose to be a brother, and served at various times as porter, cook, gardener, and official beggar.

Paschal was careful to observe the vow of poverty. He would never waste any food or anything given for the use of the friars. When he was porter and took care of the poor coming to the door, he developed a reputation for great generosity.

Paschal spent his spare moments praying before the Blessed Sacrament. In time, many people sought his wise counsel. He passed on May 15, 1592, and immediately after his burial people flocked to his tomb; miracles were reported promptly. Paschal was canonized in 1690 and was named patron of eucharistic congresses and societies in 1897.

April Reflection

The story of Jesus' encounter with his disciples on the Road to Emmaus is replete with many meanings and lessons. There is seeing Jesus in the breaking of the bread (Eucharist), being blind to things around us, Biblical revelation, fulfillment of God's promises, and much more.



While thinking about this episode, though, what came to my mind is going forth, proclaiming the Word. The disciples had not

yet received the Holy Spirit and were, indeed, at a loss as to what to do. They were energized by their encounter, though, and wanted to go forth and preach. It is this going forth of the Gospel we are called to do every time we attend Mass and hear the Word: from Gospel to Life, and life to the Gospel. It is later that Jesus gives this explicit command, but its roots are here along that road.

St. Francis did this so well during his life. In his own area of Italy, surrounding countries, and, through the Order he founded, around the globe, he proclaimed the love Jesus has for everyone and called all to be open to this wonderful gift. He definitely went beyond his comfort zone of Assisi to do this.

As Secular Franciscans, we, too, are called to proclaim by our actions the love of our Savior, using words only when necessary. We should also consider how we might move beyond our comfort zone and engage – in a loving, rather than challenging, way – with the world around us. May His love shine on others through us.
