

Chapter Two, Article 11 of The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

The Information Corner

Aug 16th – Feastday of St. Louis IX^4

1215 Born in and crowned king of France at age 12, Louis IX bound himself by oath to behave God's as anointed. While other kings had done the same, Louis was different in that he actually interpreted his kingly



duties in the light of faith. After the violence of two previous reigns, he brought peace and justice.

Louis is credited for extending justice in civil administration, and his regulations for royal officials became the first of a series of reforms. He replaced trial by battle with a form of examination of witnesses and encouraged the use of written records in court.

Louis was devoted to his people: he founded hospitals, visited the sick, and like St. Francis, cared even for people with leprosy. He is a patron of the Secular Franciscan Order. Louis united all people of France and maintained peace for many years.

Every day, Louis had 13 special guests from among the poor to eat with him, and a large number of poor were served meals near his palace. During Advent and Lent, all who asked were given a meal, and Louis often served them in person. He regularly assisted needy people in every province of his dominion.

Louis "took the cross" for a Crusade twice. The first time, when when he was 30, his army was weakened by dysentery and was surrounded and captured; Louis obtained their release by giving up a captured city and paying a ransom. The second time, in 1267, his army was decimated by disease within a month, and Louis himself died on foreign soil in 1270 at the age of 56. He was canonized 27 years later in 1297.

August Reflection By Larry Bleau, OFS

The number 40 has many Biblical, quite significant, meanings: The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years. Jesus fasted for 40 days. Moses was on Mount Saini for 40 days. And 40 years ago Pope Paul VI promulgated the current Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order: *our* Rule.

Our Rule is such a gift to us from St. Francis. While still alive, he perceived a need for some form of rule for laypersons, and created one especially for us. We have a saint's guide on how we, too, can live the Gospel way of life. Acting wisely, the Church has revised the Rule several times to meet the needs of various ages.

This may be a good time for us to reflect on our Rule. We will have a short video this month about the history of our Rule, which we'll follow with a discussion. Please take some time to reflect on what the Rule means to you, how you follow it, and what you like (or not) about it.
