Our Lady has asked that the Rosary be prayed to defeat sin in the world and in the lives of individuals. Saint Francis' courtly love of Mary brought to us in the tradition of the Crown Rosary, which commemorates the Seven Joys of Our Lady. This uniquely Franciscan prayer is a great joy for those who pray it, as it draws us into the sweet company of the Queen of the Angels as we meditate on her life with Jesus. The traditional form of the Rosary also draws us into the company of Jesus and Mary. Mary acts as our guide and model as we meditate on the life, ministry, Passion, death and resurrection of Christ.

Padre Pio called it his "weapon." Both Franciscans and Dominican Friars wear a



rosary on the left side of their habits, where soldiers traditionally wore their swords. We as "soldiers" of Christ must wield this weapon of Grace for the sake of those in peril, physical and spiritual. So many injustices, so many violations of human dignity, so many sins

against peace impel us to pray. What better way than the Rosary? In it we follow Jesus, stand with Mary at the foot of the Cross, and recall Christ raised from the dead. The practice of this mighty prayer helps us to walk out the call to holiness in our day-to-day lives.
