January Reflection

The prayers of the Saints sustain us here upon earth and assist us on our way to our Heavenly Homeland. The great "cloud of witnesses" who give us example also give us practical help in the day-to-day struggle to walk with the Lord.



How often have we stopped to pray the prayer to St. Anthony or our Guardian Angels, or patron saints for a particular need and been surprised to receive a quick answer? Can you recall when the witness of a Saint has inspired you to carry on, or encouraged you when things looked bleak? How often do we turn to our brothers and sisters who have already reached their eternal goal to ask their help on our own journey?

Of course every one of us can think of countless occasions when the Saints and Angels have ministered the grace of God to us. As we pick our Saints for the coming year (or rather allow the Saints to pick us!), let's recall that this practice is no small thing. Accepting that the Lord has assigned each of us a particular Saint for the coming year helps us to take this selection seriously. Pray to your Saint this year. Learn as much as you can about him or her. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you something new through this Saint's example and intercession, and maybe journal about your interaction with the Saint who "adopts" you. In a year's time there will be plenty of evidence of God grace at work through the Communion of Saints.
