By the time you read this it will have stopped snowing, and the temperature will have risen enough to convince us all that Spring will come after all. There are days (like the one on which I write this) when our harsh winter so dominated the landscape that it almost blotted out the memories of green grass in the sunshine or daffodils or summer temperatures.

The journey of Lent can be a little like that harsh winter. We may experience the desert of God's silence, or the chill of our blindness to His presence. We may be inundated by an avalanche of failure as we struggle to make our Lenten practices and repeatedly fall short. Yet we recall that it is God whose grace at work in us causes us to desire Him above all else.
