ADMONITION OF ST. FRANCIS

26. On the virtue of fleeing vice ¹

Where there is charity and wisdom, there (is) neither fear nor ignorance. Where there is patience and humility, there (is) neither wrath nor disturbance. Where there is poverty with gladness, there (is) neither cupidity nor avarice. Where there is quiet and meditation, there (is) neither solicitousness nor wandering about. Where there is fear of the Lord to guard the entrance hall (cf. Lk 11:21), there the enemy can have no place to enter. Where there is mercy and discretion, there (is) neither superfluity nor hardness.

The Rule

Chapter Two, Article 8 of The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

As Jesus was the true worshipper of the Father, so let prayer and contemplation be the soul of all they are and do.

Let them participate in the sacramental life of the Church, above all the Eucharist. Let them join in liturgical prayer in one of the forms proposed by the Church, reliving the mysteries of the life of Christ.

Hear my plea. Keep me, guide me, protect me, Mary, Undoer of Knots, pray o safe refuge! for me.



The Ascension – A Franciscan View

St. Bonaventure, on the Vigil of the Solemnity of the Acension (May 25, 1267), preached⁴:

"The Lord says to him [St. Francis]: Go up with my help, for I am the ladder on which you can ascend. This is signified by the ladder which Jacob saw: set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. What is this ladder other than the Lord Jesus himself, the Son of God who through his humanity is set up on earth on earth and by his divinity transcends the heavens?"

May Reflection

Some of the world's troubles became our own last week when the streets of Baltimore were witness to violence and unrest. We watched with some anxiety as businesses and property were damaged, and were deeply moved by the actions of community leaders, priests, pastors, rabbis, and ministers of all sorts who strode into the unrest with prayer and words of peace. At the height of the crisis, Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore asked that we pray the Rosary for peace and justice in Baltimore.

By now most of us have heard of the Nigerian



bishop who had a vision of Christ while praying that the dreaded Boko Haram stop persecuting his people; Jesus handed him a sword that, as the bishop reached for it, became a Rosary. From this the bishop understood that we must pray the Rosary to put a stop to violence and persecution. This calls to mind that our own beloved St. Pio of Pietrelcina referred to his Rosary as his "weapon."

The headlines are yet more evidence that the cure for the world's persistent, open, ugly wound will be found in the healing of the human heart. Life-giving and life-changing personal conversion, our own and that of the Church's self-proclaimed enemies, can only be accomplished by the Holy Spirit, fruit of the persistent prayer of the saints here and in Heaven. Through the powerful prayer of the Rosary, we unite ourselves to the constant

prayer of our human race's solitary boast, Mary, Mother of Jesus, Mother of God, Our Mother, and Our Queen.
