

April Reflection

"Most High, glorious God, enlighten the darkness of my heart and give me true faith, certain hope, and perfect charity, sense and knowledge, Lord, that I may carry out Your holy and true command." (Saint Francis – The Prayer before the Crucifix, 1205/06.)

The prayer listed above consists of only 34 words, yet its truth speaks to our hearts in profound ways. These prayerful words clearly demonstrate to us, as followers of the teachings and spiritual disciplines of Saint Francis, where our beloved founder's heart was directed during his 44 years on earth, and why the Franciscan Order he founded in 1209 continues to grow and thrive more than 800 years later.

The beauty of simplicity and truth is that neither change with time. As Franciscans we

must be vigilant and walk with courage during our relatively short time on an earth, which is becoming increasingly hostile to the faithful. We should never lose sight of the mission which Saint Francis, Saint Anthony and Saint Claire declared and embraced openly during their lifetimes.

Today's truth is the same truth which came to life as a result of Mary's fiat over two thousand years ago. One so critically important to our faith, that her Son, Jesus Christ specifically used the word to reassure Thomas during the Last Supper by saying, "I am the way and the truth and the life." (John 14:6)

I would like to sincerely thank each one of you reading this and for giving me the opportunity to serve each of you over the next three years as your new minister. I would also ask that each of you keep me in your prayers and know that you are all in mine.
