#### **The Rule**

Chapter Two, Article 23 of The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

Requests for admission to the Secular Franciscan Order

must be presented to the local fraternity, whose council decides upon the acceptance of new brothers and sisters.

Admission into the Order is gradually attained through a time of initiation, a period of formation of at least one year, and profession of the rule. The entire community is engaged in this process of growth by its own manner of living. The age for profession and the distinctive Franciscan sign are regulated by the statutes.

Profession by its nature is a permanent commitment.

Members who find themselves in particular difficulties should discuss their problems with the council in fraternal dialogue.

Withdrawal or permanent dismissal from the Order, if necessary, is an act of the fraternity council according to the norm of the constitutions.

# <u>The Information Corner –</u> <u>The Pardon of Assisi</u>

Eight hundred years ago Pope Honorius III granted a most extraordinary request by our founder, St. Francis: a plenary indulgence for those who visit the Portiuncula Chapel. In July 1216 St. Francis had a vision in which both Jesus and Mary appeared to him and Jesus allowed St. Francis to make a request for the salvation of the souls of the faithful. St. Francis made the request in response, which Jesus granted, provided Francis made the request of His Vicar on earth. St. Francis immediately put his request before the Pope. Such a broad indulgence was almost unheard of, but after much persuasion by St. Francis, Innocent III granted the request.


## August Reflection By Larry Bleau,OFS

Pope Francis speaks many times each day, and many of these are reported on Vatican Radio. On Sunday, July 24, in his Angelus address<sup>4</sup>, he focused on Jesus' teaching on prayer. After his reflection on the Our Father that is recorded in St. Luke's Gospel, he spoke further in a way that struck me as so appropriate to prayer life that I would like to share it with the Fraternity.

The two parables following the Lord's Prayer teach us "to have full confidence in God, who is Father." God does not need our prayer to discover what we need, or to be convinced to give it to us. Rather, Pope Francis said, we pray so that our faith and patience might be strengthened, so that we might "struggle" together with God for those things that are most important and necessary.

And that which is most important, but which, the Pope said, we almost never ask for, is the Holy Spirit. The gift of the Holy Spirit helps us to live well, to live with wisdom and love, doing the will of God. "What a beautiful prayer it would be," Pope Francis said, if in the coming week, "each one of us would ask of the Father, "Father, give me the Holy Spirit."

Indeed! Let us pray for the Spirit to come upon all members of our fraternity.
