
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The Information Corner¹ PRECIOUS BLOOD of JESUS

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. In July, it is the Precious Blood of Jesus². The Precious Blood, like the Sacred Heart of Jesus, has long been venerated for its role in our redemption.

The month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of the Redeemer. Supreme homage is given to the Sacred Blood. As we adore the Sacred Heart, because it is the Heart of Jesus, who is God, so we adore the Most Precious Blood.

The Blood of Jesus is the fountain of salvation. Each drop that flowed from the wounds of the Saviour is a pledge of man's eternal salvation. All races of the earth have been ransomed, and all individuals, who



will allow the saving power of the Sacred Blood to be applied to their soul, are heirs of heaven. St. John Chrysostom calls the Precious Blood "the saviour of souls"; St. Thomas Aquinas, "the key to heaven's treasures"; St. Ambrose, "pure gold of ineffable worth"; St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi, "a magnet of souls and pledge of eternal life". The sins of mankind, in their number, in their offense to the Supreme Being, in the effects on transgressors, are immense; yet, the Precious Blood of Jesus is not frightened by numbers, it has in Itself the power to appease an angered God and to heal wounded creatures.

Her favorite saint is Padre Pio, to whom she had a great devotion. She led a pilgrimage to the shrine of Padre Pio in Barto, PA, in 2001; organized a first Mass in his honor in 2002; and started a Padre Pio prayer group within the Fraternity.

July Reflection

A Reading from 'The Earlier Rule' of St. Francis – A Sense of the Divine

None of the brothers may be treasurers or overseers in any of those places where they are staying to serve or work among others. They may not be in charge in the houses in which they serve nor accept any office which would generate scandal or be harmful to their souls; let them, instead, be the lesser ones and be subject to all in the same house.

Let the brothers who know how to work do so and exercise that trade they have learned, provided it is not contrary to the good of their souls and can be performed honestly. For the prophet says, "You shall eat the fruit of your labours; you are blessed and it shall be well for you." The Apostle says, "Whoever does not wish to work shall not eat." And "Let everyone remain in that trade and office in which he has been called."

And for their work they can receive whatever is necessary excepting money. And when it is necessary, they may seek alms like other poor people. Let them not be ashamed. And it is lawful for them to have the tools and instruments suitable for their trades.

Let all the brothers always strive to exert themselves in doing good works, for it is written, "Always do something good that the devil may find you occupied." And again, "Idleness is an enemy of the soul." Servants of God, therefore, must always apply themselves to prayer or some good work.
