

Second Week: Two purple candles are lit.

Seasons To Reflect Upon

Thanksgiving and Advent are Seasons of Praise and Preparation. St. Francis and Clare spent their lives in praise of Jesus Christ and in preparation to one day meet their Lord and Maker. We, too, should reflect each day on our blessings and praise God for them. Praise releases the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives and should be given, not only in good times but also in bad. This is not an easy task when things are difficult, but it is one St. Paul speaks of in his letter to Timothy. He tells Timothy to persevere, whether it is convenient or inconvenient. This is one of the reasons the Church offers different Liturgical seasons; to make our hearts ready in preparation for our journey to our eternal home.



Advent reminds us of the preparation we must do to welcome the Lord into our hearts. Our hearts should become the bed in which Jesus can be born. In order to make our hearts ready, we must spend time in prayer, adoration, thanksgiving, and we must receive the Sacraments worthily. We must dissipate all hatred, misgivings, animosity and slander towards one another and instead strive to live in peace, harmony, and joy.

In order to celebrate Christmas and to show the awesome humility of God, St. Francis decided to reenact the first Christmas crèche. Francis, with the assurance of friendship, sent word to his friend, John Vellita: "If you want to celebrate the Feast of the Lord at Greccio, hurry and diligently prepare what I tell you. For I wish to recall to memory the little child who was born in Bethlehem. I want to set before our bodily eyes the hardships of his infant needs, how he lay in the manger, how with an ox and ass standing by he lay upon the hay." Francis wanted to make known the human Jesus to the world, the Jesus, who loved us enough to shed his divinity for us.

During this Advent Season, let us remember the two sister virtues that Francis strove so hard to imitate; poverty and humility. In this way, we will empty out ourselves and open up our hearts for the coming of Our Lord.
