2. The Wickedness of Self Will¹

The Lord said to Adam: From "every tree eat, however, from the tree of good and evil you may not eat" (cf. Gen 2:16.17). From every tree of paradise he could eat, because while he did not go against obedience, he did not sin. For one eats of the tree of the knowledge of good, who appropriates his own will to himself and exalts himself because of the good things, which the Lord says and works in him; and so through the suggestion of the devil and the transgression of the mandate it has become the fruit of the knowledge of evil. Whence it is proper, that he endure punishment.



The Rule

Chapter Three, Article 25 of The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

May Reflection By Vicky Spalding, SFO

Our Lady, Our Mother

When I think of May, I immediately think of the Blessed Mother. During May, we celebrate Mother's Day, and who better to show us how to be a loving Mother, but Our Lady, herself! She is truly the most perfect example of what it means to love selflessly.



Not only did Jesus draw His love and strength from His Mother, but He also took on her human flesh. Bishop Fulton Sheen is quoted as saying these words about the Immaculate Conception of Mary:

Now if you who are an imperfect being and who have not the most delicate conception of all that is fine in life would have wished for the loveliest of mothers, do you think that our Blessed Lord, who not only pre-existed His own mother but who had an infinite power to make her just what He chose, would in virtue of all the infinite delicacy of His spirit make her any less pure and loving and beautiful than you would have made your own mother? If you who hate selfishness would have made her selfless and you who hate ugliness would have made her beautiful, do you not think that the Son of God, who hates sin, would have made His own mother sinless and He who hates moral ugliness would have made her immaculately beautiful?

This month we will take a look at the difference between Meditation and Contemplation. We will use the rosary as an example of how we can imitate Francis and live out our charism of Gospel to Life and Life to Gospel,



through meditating on the different decades of the rosary. Blessed John Paul II said the rosary is a Christological prayer, since it draws us closer to Christ. And isn't this what Our Lady does??? As she said at the Wedding Feast of Cana, "Do whatever He tells you."
