ADMONITION OF ST. FRANCIS

4. Let no one appropriate to himself superior over others ¹

I did not come "to be ministered unto, but to minister" (cf. Mt 20:28), says the Lord. Let those, who are set up over others, glory as much because of that office of superior, as if they had been appointed to the office of washing the feet of the brothers. And in as much as they are more disturbed because of having lost their office of superior than because of (having lost) the office regarding feet, so much more do they assemble purses for themselves to the danger of their souls (cf. The official name of our Order (in Latin) is, and always has been, Ordo Franciscanus Sæcularis. In English speaking countries, the approved translation is "Secular Franciscan Order." At the XIII General Chapter of the Order in Saõ Paulo, October 22-29, 2011, it was decided that, as a sign of worldwide unity, **OFS** is to be used to refer to the Order whenever an acronym is used; e.g., after the name of a professed Secular Franciscan.
